Advanced Training Course Descriptions

“Knowledge, Strength and Honor”

Advanced Report Writing

Course Dates: July 20th - 21st

Course Length: 16 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course is intended to provide skills and knowledge in identifying the essential elements that should be included in a report. It provides instruction in completing a complete, clear, and accurate incident and supplemental reports.

Note: This is a core course for POST Advanced Certification.

Advanced Traffic Law

Course Dates: August 24th - 26th

Course Length: 24 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course is intended to develop and/or enhance the skills and abilities of law enforcement officers in interpreting the Uniform Rules of the Road. Topics will include statutes related to motor vehicle laws and reviewing any recent court decisions which effect current laws. Participants will complete research assignments utilizing Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated and other related reference publications.

Note: This is a core course for POST Advanced Certification.

AR-15 Armorer Course

Course Dates: August 9th - 10th

Course Length: 16 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course covers all M16/AR15 type carbine weapons systems made and their variants. Armorers will be certified in the proper maintenance, care, and repair of these weapons systems, including semi-auto and select-fire trigger systems. This program follows the Manufacturer's guidelines and is taught by FBI and NRA Certified Instructors.

Basic Patrol Rifle

Course Dates: September 21st - 23rd

Course Length: 24 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course is designed for officers armed with a rifle while on duty or for Special Response Team officers armed with an open-sighted rifle. The course will include shooting with a sling, shooting from various positions, effects of weather, leads, tactical applications, safety, maintenance and liability. Students will engage single and multiple targets from 7 - 100 yards, both stationary and moving. Students will need an open-sighted rifle, sling, extra magazine and any other accessories used while on duty.

Note: Students will need to bring at least 500 rounds of ammunition.

Concealed-Carry Skills

Course Dates: November 10th

Course Length: 6 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course is designed for plain clothes police officers who are charged with the responsibility of carrying a concealed weapon. This course may also prove valuable to uniform personnel who are authorized to carry a backup weapon on or off duty.

Confined Space Combatives

Course Dates: September 9th - 10th

Course Length: 16 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course will introduce DT & Combative Instructors to the fundamentals as well as demonstrate applications for training and threat management in any confined space. This is an advanced course for physically fit and focused trainers from the military or law enforcement only. This intensive session will also teach DT & Combative Instructors how to integrate the tactics to intercept the assailant's initial attach in confined spaces.

Note: This course is offered by Blauer Tactical Systems. There will be a course fee of \$249 paid before 07/24/10, \$299 after 07/24/10, 3 or more from the same agency and the 4th is \$149, due by the first day of the course. Courtroom Testimony and Demeanor

Course Dates: October 12th

Course Length: 8 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course of instruction will provide officers with an understanding of terminology, pretrial responsibilities and effective techniques for providing testimony. The training will consist of classroom lecture, discussion and mock courtroom situations.

Note: Newly hired officers and those who have not attended previous courtroom training are required to attend.

Health and Wellness Awareness

Course Dates: September 14th - 16th

Course Length: 22 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course is designed for all public safety personnel who seek improved health and wellness. Topics include the cardiovascular system, strength and flexibility conditioning, nutrition, weight and stress control, and the effects of alcohol/drugs.

Note: This is a core course for POST Intermediate Certification. Attendees must bring shoes for walking/running, non-marking court shoes, and work-out clothes.

Interviews and Interrogations

Course Dates: October 6th - 8th

Course Length: 24 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course is an advanced level course of the latest techniques in (1) determining truth or deception, and (2) in the case of deception, obtaining a legal confession. Methods included are: Statement Content Analysis, Neuro-Linguistic Programming, Multiple Suspect Elimination, as well as special topics on interviewing children and reluctant witnesses. The course format is one of lecture followed by practical exercise and presents the latest and most powerful techniques of detection of deception and convincing strategies.

Note: This is a core course for POST Advanced Certification.

Investigating Use of Force for Field Supervisors

Course Dates: November 3rd

Course Length: 8 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This seminar will include the following topics: how to effectively and efficiently investigate use of force cases, how to recognize and identify the subtle clues often overlooked in the investigation and how to avoid common pitfalls in police practices, including tactical and training issues leading to pattern and practice claim sand civil rights investigations.

Mossberg Armorer Course

Course Date: July 14th - 15th

Course Length: 16 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course covers the Mossberg 500/590/590DA shotgun systems and provides instruction on how to diagnose and repair malfunctions, return shotguns to factory specs, perform function inspections, check headspace and more. Armorer training classes are a mixture of classroom instruction and hands-on exercises, enabling each student to achieve a high degree of familiarity with the topics covered.

This course is designed to provide training in the dynamics of an armed encounter. Students will receive training in combat firearms skills, defensive tactics, handcuffing techniques, patrol tactics, vehicle stops, and building searches.

Search Warrants & Affidavits

Course Date: August 11th - 12th

Course Length: 16 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: Training Section

This course familiarizes the student with an overview of search and seizure, based on the Fourth Amendment, and the legal requirements for obtaining and executing search warrants.

Note: This is a core course for POST Advanced Certification.

Shotgun Skills

Course Dates: August 18th

Course Length: 8 hours

Course Times: 0830 - 1730 hrs

Location: River Bend Gun Club

This course is designed to improve shooting skills with 12 gauge pump and semi-automatic shotguns. Range exercises and classroom instruction will be provided in mounting, loading, unloading, and shooting drills to increase the officer's effectiveness with this versatile weapon. Officers will also participate in exercises using multiple targets, tactical shooting positions, proper use of cover, and one-hand operation.

Note: Students should bring a 12 gauge pump action or semi-automatic shotgun equipped with a sling and 75 rounds of duty shotgun shells.
